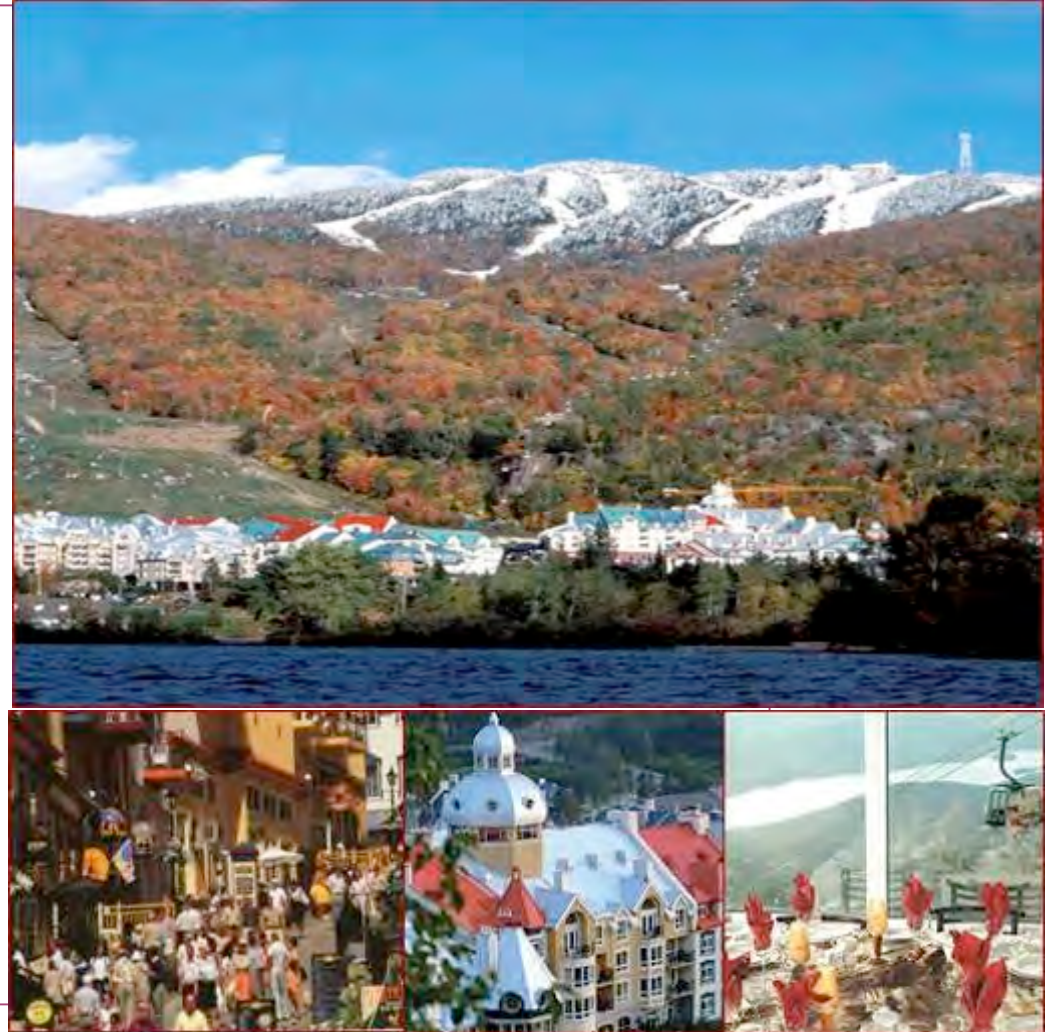

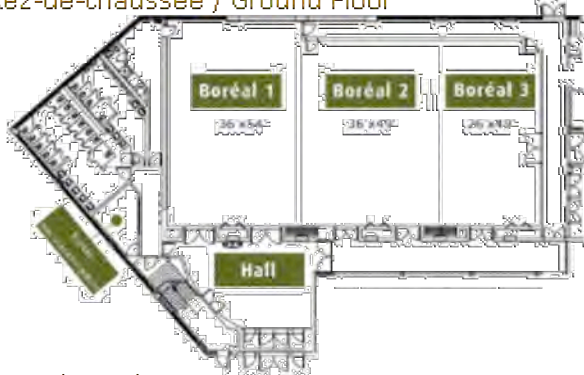
The Convention Centre

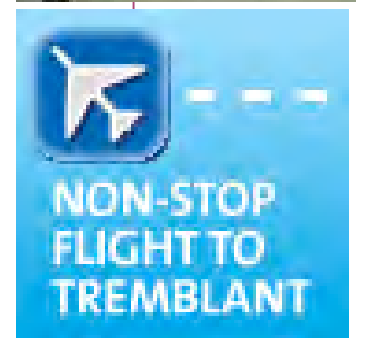
