Dear P802.16g Balloting Group:

Thank you for your participation in the Sponsor Ballot of P802.16g/D8. The first ballot recirculation ran from 29 January to 13 February 2007. The numerical results currently stand at 130 Approve, 6 Disapprove, and 13 Abstain. This satisfies the numerical conditions for approval. These numbers do not consider any possible changes in vote as a result of comment resolution.

Comments arising in the first recirculation were resolved by a Ballot Resolution Committee, with eight members, as authorized by the IEEE 802.16 Working Group during its Session #47 in January. We have uploaded the resolutions, along with the editor's implementation notes, to the IEEE-SA myBallot system. In addition to the 14 comments submitted through myBallot, the 802.16 Working Group received another 59 comments directly. Comment #15 includes a PDF file documenting all 73 of these comments, including their resolutions. In the PDF, the myBallot comments are numbered 1-14, matching the myBallot numbers; the additional comments are numbered 115-173. Note that some changes refer to documents contributed directly to the 802.16 Working Group. These are available at <http://ieee802.org/16/netman/16g.html#contrib>.

We are requesting that the IEEE Balloting Center initiate a fifteen-day recirculation of the new draft P802.16g/D8 (file *P80216g_D8.pdf*, or *P80216g_D8.zip* in ZIP form).

Please take this opportunity to review the material. Since this is a recirculation ballot, you need respond only if you wish to change your initial vote. If you do not respond to this recirculation ballot, your last vote will be carried forward. Also, as this is a recirculation ballot, a change to "do not approve" (i.e., a negative vote) with comments shall be based only on the changed portions of the balloted document, clauses affected by the changes, or portions of the balloted document that are the subject of the unresolved negative votes.

If you have voted Disapprove, I urge you to review the comment resolutions and let us know which, if any, of your comments have been satisfactorily resolved. If you choose to cast an Approve vote, we will assume that all of them are resolved to your satisfaction.
